
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I invite you to visit London with me

The Tower of London delights with its scale and history. It was built in 1078 for William the Conqueror. The main role of the building was a prison. To this day, the fortress is inhabited by guards and functionaries. The symbol of the monument are black ravens. A legend says that as long as there are ravens in the towers of the Tower, the British Empire exists.

Tower Bridge is a drawbridge.
It was built in 1895.

Big Ben is a clock placed on the tower, which is named after the queen - Elizabeth Tower.



Westminster Palace is the location of the British Parliament. It is inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Now it's time for Trafalgar Square

It is a traditional place of political and New Year's Eve meetings and gatherings. The world premiere of the film "Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows - Part II" took place here in 2011

You can see Egyptian mummies




THE NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM

The palace was built in 1703. When the Queen is in the Palace, the royal banner is raised, and when she is absent, the banner is taken down. From April to July every day at 11.30 am there is a ceremonial changing of the guard. In August and September you can visit the apartments of the residence.

The seven noses of Soho

There are more than seven of those. They stick out of various public objects on Floral Street.



Noses on the district of London - Soho are the work of the sculptor Rick Buckley. He left his noses made of plaster in the years 1996 - 2005. It is difficult to find all of them. Some of them may not exist anymore. Buckley provoked the local authorities of Westminster by placing his noses on Soho. Every time the local government of Westminster, according to Buckley, made mistakes or a wrong decision, his nose popped up on the Soho.

It's good to know, that...

The Animal Cemetery, which is a particularly surreal place, is located in London's famous Victorian Hyde Park just behind Victoria Gate Lodge . This place is closed to the public. It is shrouded in mystery. About 300 domestic animals were buried in the cemetery.

Haunted Parkland Walk



Derelict railroads get even scarier - Parkland Walk, which runs between Finsbury Park and Alexandra Palace, is lively green, but there's still something unsettling about wandering up an overgrown hillside. The section that passes Crouch End is the scariest section of the route, where the ghost of a "spriggan" lurks from an unused railroad curve, ready to surprise unknowing passers-by.

Haunted Bruce Castle Museum

Here on the gloomy winter nights in November, you can see the ghostly silhouette of Lady Constantia Lucy staring out the window. Lady Lucy killed herself jumping off the balcony of a castle with her child, in the 17th century. It is said that a great mystery surrounds the death of the lady, but the fact that her husband kept her locked in a small room may have something to do with it.



Bruce Castle Museum in London is a Grade I listed 16th century manor house set in 20 acres of parkland. Since 1906 Bruce Castle has been a museum and now houses the Borough of Haringey's local history collections, archives and art exhibitions. The museum holds regular historical and arts events.
